Yes, the college used a college management software (CMMS) in the office by which all information regarding students teachers and non-teaching staff, admission, examination and college accounts is collected and circulated.

- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college has right to develop any curriculum. It follows and implements the curriculum framed by the university.

### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Though the syllabi are framed not by the college yet each department adopts some innovative processes in teaching and learning.

- 1. The faculties of each department prepare the academic calendar for that year and rigorously follow that throughout the year.
- 2. The departments organize students' seminars, quiz contests, poetry/drama workshops



#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college serves as a centre for the university examinations each year. The college also conducts class tests and term tests to evaluate the progress of the students. The answer scripts of such tests are shown to the students to correct their errors.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college encourages teachers to avail research facilities and the institution makes arrangement for necessary space and equipments. They are also provided with research journal and books to carry on their research works. A good number of teachers are engaged to complete their ongoing projects

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

To develop and update facilities in the library, the college has adopted the following strategies:

- i) The physical infrastructure is slighly improved/developed
- i) Few new computers have been added to the library.
- ii) Latest books and journals are purchased and subscribed to every year.
- iii) Total computerisation of the library service is on progress.
- iv) Library related information is provided to the students and the teachers.
- v) Internet service has been made available to the library users.
- vi) Departmental libraries are gradually improving

The human resource of the college is managed in a free and democratic manner. For the management of the students' affair, the college has a students' union whose elections are held annually as per university statutes. The teachers' council and the non-teaching staff association look after the affairs of the teaching and non-teaching staff respectively.
